Week 1: Welcome Week

The first day of camp shall be June 27th, on this day the animators will assign campers to each group. The animators will then proceed to do many be breaker/get-to-know-you games. They will also come up with the group name. START (on calendar). June 28 is a 4-5-6 exclusive party called: Welcome Hotdog Fiesta. Animators continue getting to know their groups while enjoying a great barbecued.

Week 2: Sports Week

The week will begin on July 1st, which is none other than Canada Day. There will be various activities that the city of Montréal is offering (@park Armand Bombardier) all groups and grades will be participating. The following activity that week will be Stupendous Sports Challenge, which is a center-wide theme day. There shall also be various Carnival Day Activities (beanbag race, horseshoe toss, soccer-baseball etc.) The Don Bosco Project is something the entire center of 4-5-6 will be working on throughout the entire summer. It consists of creating a life-size cutout of Saint Don Bosco with memorable quotes and artwork of every single child. Soccer Tournament Day is a special day where the sole focus will be the classy European sport known as football a.k.a Soccer. There will be a Gold Cup of Summer camp tournament, training from an actual European pro soccer player, along with penalty shootouts, Golden Goal etc. The week will end off with the children attending mass and a special surprise from SEFS where they will be having a carnival day with inflatables.

Week 3: Fear Week

The third week will consist of a bullying Workshop (called Be a Friend) the children will have moments of reflection, there shall be witness talks by the animators and fun games used to showcase everyone's individuality. Will have pool booked for the afternoon. Then there is the Fright fest Challenge where the children and animators will be under going various trials like in the show Fear Factor. Everything that will be provided will be peanut free. July 10th is a Universal outing at the Movies. Spa and Hockey Day is where the boys of grades 4-5-6 will be having a hockey tournament at Don Bosco Park while the girls will have a relaxing spa day planned. Splash Away Day is a day where the Coordinators will have various water activities planned for all groups of all grades.

Week 4: Survival Week

The week will commence with the Grade 6 Social Justice Project which entails all the older children in grade 6 bring in toys to fill up a box which will be given to the less fortunate. There will also be activities and workshops to go along with it. The next big event this week is the Amazing Race Challenge where the children with their respective animators for their group will be having a scavenger hunt with various envelopes hidden throughout the parks near the DBYLC. On Wednesday, we will be having a beach theme day filled with lots of fun and games. The Crazy Cooking Challenge is a fun activity that requires the help of the animators, the children will be learning various techniques to preparing wholesome snacks that are not only peanut free but super healthy (inspired by Master Chef). We will try booking the pool in the afternoon. To end the week off with a faithful mass and the afternoon will be used for the Derby Race which is a Universal Theme Day presented by SEFS.

Saturday July 20th: Dek Hockey Tournament

On Saturday July 20th, there will be a Dek hockey tournament in honor of a past leader of the YLC Joe Tortorici. This day will include various ball hockey games and lots of other fun as well! Both girls and boys can participate. It will take place at Don Bosco Park from 9am to 4pm. We hope to see you there!

Week 5: Water Week

During water week we will dive into lots of fun. The week will commence with Popsicle making day where each group will be making their own popsicles in the morning, so that they have a cool snack by the end of the day! Then for Wacky Water Games it will be a theme day set up by animators where they will find creative ways to incorporate water into games. On July 24th there is the center outing of Olympic pool and Planetarium Center Outing. A more artistic theme day will be Color Water Balloon Fight, where campers will wear their own white t-shirts and get involved in a water balloon fight with the added touch of food coloring. Finally there is the super fantastic show us your talent day, which is a universal activity that will be like Americas got talent where each child is allowed to showcase their individual spectacular talents in front of everyone.

Week 6: Science Week

During the Science Week there will be various activities for the children. One being the Smile Mental healthness workshop: It's a workshop where the various grades will have an afternoon of informative and fun activities planned that will bring awareness to the kids. There will be a major outing for Center 4-5-6: it's the Science Center and Old Port Fun on July 30th. Then there is the Spectacular Science day: it's a theme Day set up by animators. The children must find creative experiments that are safe, fun, and easy to do with the groups. A special visit from a bug expert showcasing what all the insects look like. There is also the grade 6 Gala, where all the grade 6 children will be asked to dress up for a fancy occasion. For grades 4 and 5 we will try scheduling pool that day. We will end off the week with mass and the Walk-a-thon where all kids will be asked to participate.

Week 7: Final Week

The Final week will commence with Animator Appreciation Day where we give the campers the opportunities to show how much they appreciate their animators. Animators also prepare dances for big show. Coordinator surprise, is well a surprise and we don't want to spoil it too much but it's where the coordinators will treat campers and animators to various sweets (popcorn, Mr. freeze and maybe some inflatables). The week will end off with Big Show where all the groups of all the grades will be showcasing their fantastic talents in front of their friends, family and animators.

No NUT products allowed!


